1.1 PRESENT SIMPLE & PRESENT CONTINUOUS

When we know about the future, we can use the **present tense**:

- We have a lesson next Monday.
- The train arrives at 6.30 in the morning.
- · The winter break starts next week.
- It's my birthday tomorrow.

We can use the **present continuous** for **plans or arrangements**:

- · I'm playing football tomorrow.
- Students in group 8 are visiting the museum on Friday.
- · We're having a party at Christmas.
- · They aren't coming to see us tomorrow.

1.2 WILL

- a) When we express **beliefs or hopes** about the future, we can use will:
 - It will be a nice day tomorrow.
 - · I think Brazil will win the World Cup in football.
 - · Sarah says she will help us.
- b) When we make **offers or promises**, we can use *will*:
 - · I'll see you tomorrow.
 - · We'll send you an email.
- c) When speaking, we use will to express a **spontaneous unplanned action**:
 - · [The phone rings.] I'll answer!
 - · [A book falls on the floor.] Don't worry. I'll pick it up.
- d) We use will with the word probably:
 - I'll probably read that paper on the weekend.
 - The class will probably be online because of the bad weather.





1.3 BE + GOING TO

- a) We can use *be* + *going to* for expressing **plans and intentions**:
 - Annie's going to take the metro today.
 - The Romeros are going to move to Chiloé in January.
 - We are going to order a pizza later.
 - · I'm not going to participate in the conference next year.
- b) We can use be + going to for predictions based on evidence:
 - · The meteorological service says it's going to rain.
 - That house is in bad condition. It's going to collapse in the next storm.
 - · George is not very social. He's not going to enjoy the party.

1.4 MIGHT

- a) We can use *might* when we're **not sure** about the future:
 - · I might stay at home tonight. I'm not sure yet.
 - · We might see Larry at the next meeting. He goes sometimes.
 - · It's quite bright. It might not rain today.
