6. burglary	f) deceiving somebody out of money or property
7. domestic violence	g) hiding evidence, threatening witnesses, etc.
8. drug trafficking	h) entering a building with intent to commit a crime
9. drunk driving	i) giving money etc. to influence a public official
10. embezzlement	j) illegally trying to avoid paying taxes

15. <i>insider dealing</i>	o) operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol
16. <i>joyriding</i>	p) repeatedly following and/ or harassing a person with unwanted attention
17. <i>kidnapping</i>	q) stealing a car and driving it dangerously for fun
18. <i>manslaughter</i>	r) stealing from an employer
19. <i>money laundering</i>	s) stealing merchandise from a shop or business
20. <i>obstruction of justice</i>	t) inflicting harmful or offensive contact on a victim.
21. <i>rape</i>	u) taking a person against his/her will (or taking a child from the control of a parent or guardian)
22. <i>shoplifting</i>	v) using a weapon to take money or property by force or direct threat of violence
23. <i>stalking</i>	w) unlawful killing but without intent to kill
24. <i>tax evasion</i>	x) using confidential knowledge to give yourself an advantage when buying or selling stocks and shares
25. <i>theft</i>	y) using violence or threats to have sex without consent
26. <i>vandalism</i>	z) violence or abuse against a member of the offender's own household (e.g. wife/husband and children)
