



GRAMMAR SUPPLEMENT THE PAST CONTINUOUS

1.1 USE

a) Interrupted action in the past. Use the past continuous to indicate that a longer action in the past was interrupted. The interruption is usually a shorter action in the simple past. Remember this can be a real interruption or just an interruption in time.



- · I was watching TV when she called.
- When the phone rang, she was writing a letter.
- · While we were having the picnic, it started to rain.
- What were you doing when the earthquake happened?
- b) Specific time as an interruption.
- Last night at 10 pm, I was playing a computer game.
- · Yesterday at this time, I was sitting at my desk at work.
- What were you doing this time last year?
- c) **Parallel actions**. When you use the past continuous with two actions in the same sentence, it expresses the idea that both actions were happening at the same time.
- · I was studying while he was making dinner.
- · While Ellen was reading. Tim was watching a video.
- Were you listening while he was talking?

1.2 FORM

The past continuous is formed using the past form of "to be" was / were + verb-ing. Questions are created by inverting the subject and was / were. Negatives are made with not.

Affirmative: You were studying when she called.
 Question: Were you studying when she called?
 Negative: You were not studying when she called.
