



# GRAMMAR SUPPLEMENT THE PRESENT PERFECT

### **1.1 FORM**

The present perfect is formed using **have / has + the past participle of the verb**. With most verbs, the past participle is formed by **adding -ed** to the base form (infinitive):

call <b>ed</b> want <b>ed</b> work <b>ed</b>	lik <b>ed</b> studi <b>e</b>	ed played stopped

But there are a lot of **irregular past participle** forms in English. Here are the most common irregular past participles (the third column), with the past tense forms for comparison:

Some past participles end in -n, some are the same as the base (present) form, some are the same as the past form.

### **1.2 USE**

- a) We use the present perfect to talk about something that **started in the past and continues in the present**:
- They have worked here for 10 years.
- She has lived in Santiago all her life.
- We have always been fans of swimming.
- b) We use the present perfect to talk about our **experiences** up to the present:
- · I've seen that film before.
- · Tom has ridden a motorcycle.
- I've never appeared in a movie.





- c) We use the present perfect with the adverb **ever** to talk about our **experiences** up to the present:
- That was the best pizza I've ever had.
- Have you ever met a celebrity?
- d) We use the present perfect with the adverb *never* to talk about **no experience** up to the present:
- My aunt has never played a video game.
- · I've never eaten spinach salad.
- I have never been a member of that club.
- e) We use the present perfect to talk about something that **happened in the past** that **is** relevant or important in the present:
- · I can't get into the house because I've lost my keys.
- Tess isn't at home. She's gone to the gym.
- I was extremely hungry, so I've eaten three large pizzas with extra cheese.
- f) We use the present perfect with certain **time adverbs connected to the present**: *just, today, recently, already / yet, for, since, this week / month / year...*
- l've just heard the news.
- · The weather has recently been very good.
- · The study has already been completed, but the data hasn't been analyzed yet.
- Lisa has been a teacher for 10 years. She's worked here since she graduated.
- · We haven't had any tests this month.
- · I've had four cups of coffee today.

### 1.3 QUESTIONS AND NEGATIVE FORMS

- a) We use inversion of *have* and the subject to make **questions** with the present perfect:
- Have you heard the news?
- Have we covered Unit 5 in the course?
- **Has it** rained?
- b) We use *haven't (have not)* to make **negatives** with the present perfect:
- I haven't finished the assignment.
- · The teacher hasn't uploaded the instructions.
- The room is still occupied. The presentation hasn't finished.





## 1.4 HAVE BEEN & HAVE GONE

We use have been when someone has gone to a place and returned:

- · A: Where have you been?
  - B: I've been to administration center.
- A: **Have you ever been** to Rio de Janeiro?
  - B: No, I haven't, but I've been to Sao Paulo.
- A: Where is Cathy?
  - B: She's gone to Talca. She'll be back on Friday.
