Structuring your paragraphs

This exercise is designed to help you to write paragraphs to construct a well–evidenced and coherent argument:

- 1. Start with a topic sentence
- 2. Develop your point
- 3. Provide evidence
- 4. Evaluate the evidence
- 5. Summarise

It is designed to be used once you have planned your assignment and have the notes to hand that you will use in the essay. You may also find it useful to complete 'Your essay question' and 'Writing your introduction' first to identify exactly what the question is asking you to do.
