



GRAMMAR SUPPLEMENT: BASICS OF RELATIVE CLAUSES

Reasons for their use:

To provide more information: They add extra details about a person or thing.

Torres del Paine, which is located in Patagonia, is a beautiful place.

Ricardo Montalbán, who was on a popular TV series, was a Mexican actor.

To specify or define a noun: They provide necessary information to identify which person or thing you are talking about.

The ice cream flavor that I like best is vanilla.

The woman who answered the phone is my coworker.

To avoid repetition: They are useful for combining sentences without repeating the same noun.

Spanish, which is spoken in many countries, is a Romance language.

Jogging, which is a pretty simple activity, is a great form of exercise.

Tim, who is a great cook, knows a lot about this subject.

To create more complex sentences: They help to enrich the meaning of a sentence by connecting clauses and adding detail.

The month, when I was born, was a very turbulent time.

The lab, where they discovered a new element, is located on this campus.

Your opinions, which I may not agree with, will be respected.

Forming relative clauses:

We form relative clauses by inserting a sentence into another sentence using a connector (relative pronoun or adverb) to make one new sentence.

The house was built in 1976. You want to buy it. = The house that you want to buy was built in 1976.

That animal is a gazelle. It is eating grass. = The animal <u>that is eating grass</u> is a gazelle.

The scientist discovered radium. The scientist was a woman. = The scientist who discovered radium was a woman.

We use the connectors: that or which for things and animals

Tea is a popular drink in England. Tea is grown in China. = Tea, <u>which is grown in China</u>, is a popular drink in England.

The thing was a plane. You saw it in the sky. = The thing that you saw in the sky was a plane.

We use the connector: who for people

The people spoke a different language. They used to live here. = The people <u>who</u> <u>used to live here</u> spoke a different language.

The man was at the restaurant. He is a great author. = The man who was at the restaurant is a great author.

We use the connectors: when for times, and where for locations





I remember the day. We first met then. = I remember the day <u>when we first met</u>. This is the café. I like to get coffee there. = This is the café <u>where I like to get</u> coffee.
