Present Perfect
Continuous

Present perfect continuous



USAGE

Only with actions

This tense cannot be used with stative verbs (be, have got, etc.)

How long

With this tense we usually inform the listener how long the action has been.

Long actions

It is used for actions that have been going on for a long time.

For temporary actions

This tense suggests that the action will finish one day

Explanations

The tense is used to explain a result we see now.



What's the difference?

I have worked as a volunteer for 7 years

v/s

I have been working as a volunteer for 7 years



None!!

In both sentences the speaker started the action in 2012 and it is still going on.

Both are correct but in everyday use, native speakers prefer to use the Present Perfect Continuous .

So, Can I use any of them?



But there are some restrictions...



Restrictions to use the PPC

1. Quantities

a. I have been cooking 10 cakes



b. I have cooked 10 cakes



Restrictions to use the PPC

2. Punctual Verbs

a. I have found a 10 dollar bill on the Street



b. I have been finding a 10 dollar bill on the Street

► 3. Non action verbs (like, have, know, etc)

a. I have loved Ricardo Daring since I was a little girl

b. I have been loving Ricardo Darin since I was a little girl
